Important Updates, Reminders, & Deadlines

Town Hall in June & July

There will not be regularly scheduled Town Hall meetings in June or July unless new guidance is received from USDA. Town Hall meetings will resume in August.

Claim Deadlines for State Fiscal Year End – Child Care Centers & Daycare Homes

Child & Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) April and May claims submitted and in “Approved” status by 8 am on Tuesday, June 10 will be paid and money deposited by Friday, June 13. If April and May claims are not submitted by this time, payment will not be made until July due to the state fiscal year end closeout. Remember, the April claim deadline for both original and upward revisions is Sunday, June 29.

Open CACFP Audits

KSDE is working to catch up on outstanding audits from past program years (PY18-PY23). We will do our best to include all outstanding audits for the sponsor in one email. When the email comes, it will have a separate attachment for each CACFP audit with a summary in the body of the email. The sponsor may also receive a duplicate copy of a previous audit letter as a reminder of the audit status. Safeguards are in place to ensure that fiscal action is not assessed twice for the same audit. If you have questions, contact information will be listed at the bottom of the audit letter.

School Breakfast for Morning Preschool Students

All Kansas public schools are required by State law to participate in the School Breakfast Program unless they meet certain criteria and receive an annual waiver from the Kansas State Department of Education. Starting in SY 2025-26, if morning preschool students are counted in the student enrollment count on September 20, schools must offer these students breakfast. This requirement is per Kansas State Statute 72-17,145.

Reminder: Use #FuelingKSKids on Social Media

When sharing on social media, be sure to use the hashtag #FuelingKSKids. This allows KSDE and all Kansas sponsors to see all the great meals, snacks, and activities being offered in your programs!

Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) Outreach

If your Sponsor does not have SFSP sites, consider sharing a link to the site locator tool with families. This would allow families to find a location to receive free meals at sites across Kansas. The site locator tool is available at <https://cnw.ksde.gov> under SFSP, SFSP Locate a Site Near You. **Now available:** CNW also has summer meal site locator cards available in bulk quantities for program operators. The cards are the size of a business card and contain a QR code that households can scan to access the Locate a Site Near You webpage. Contact Katy Hatch at katy.hatch@ksde.gov to request cards.



Various texting services and hunger hotlines are also available. The automated texting service that connects families to local summer meal sites is 914-342-7744. Individuals can text a question that contains a keyword such as “food” or “summer meals”. Parents and caregivers can also text the word “food” or “comida” to 304-304 to find the nearest meal sites through the No Kid Hungry Hotline. The USDA National Hunger Hotline number is also available – individuals can call 1-866-3-HUNGRY or 1-877-8-HAMBRE to speak with a representative who will find food resources such as meal sites, food banks, and other nearby social services.

SUN Bucks 2025

SUN Bucks, also known as Summer EBT, is a program to help families buy food for their school-aged children during the summer. Families will get a one-time benefit of \$120 per year for each eligible child to help buy groceries during the summer months. Children who get SUN Bucks can still participate in other summer meal programs. Receiving SUN Bucks will not affect children or families' immigration status. If a child's household did not receive a letter from DCF in January 2025 regarding SUN Bucks eligibility, they can apply through the DCF self-service portal at dcfapp.kees.ks.gov. Applications for 2025 SUN Bucks must be submitted no later than 5 pm on August 29, 2025. The SUN Bucks benefit distributions expected to begin in mid to late April 2025 have been delayed. An updated distribution timeline has not been determined, but updates will be provided on the DCF website and Facebook page - @KansasDCF. Culinary Coaches – NEW Training Program!

This training opportunity allows sponsors to request in-person, hands-on culinary training conducted at their site.
